MONTHLY PROPERTY INSPECTIONS

Monthly property inspections are conducted to ensure that the common areas and individual lots are being properly maintained. To maintain aesthetics, it is also the Board's obligation to ensure that the CC&R's are being adhered to; therefore letters will be sent for any noted violations.

PAINTING

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

<u>CC&R's</u>, <u>Article 7.1</u> The Board of Directors has architectural control over both the exclusive and non-exclusive use portions of the common area.

CC&R's, Article 7.1.1 No changes or additions to the exterior of the living units (including the planting of trees, installation of antennas, satellite dishes, skylights, air conditioners, doors, screen doors, windows, sunshades, awnings, walls, fences, patio or deck covers, exterior painting, sports equipment, etc) may be made unless approved by the Board of Directors PRIOR TO STARTING ANY WORK.

CC&R's, Article 7.1.2 No clothing or household fabrics or other unsightly articles shall be hung, dried or aired on any portion of the Property, including the interior or any Residence, so as to be visible from other Residences or the street.

<u>CC&R's</u>, <u>Article 7.1.3</u> No portion of the Property shall be used for the storage of building materials, or any other materials.

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

This holiday season don't let the spirit of giving lull you into giving burglars, muggers and pickpockets a better chance to do their dirty work. Crooks love the holidays as much as everyone else, but chiefly because it's an opportune time for crime.

If you're at home:

- Be cautious of telephone scams.
- Report any suspicious behavior or someone that does not belong in our community.
- Keep your garage door closed except when entering and exiting.
- Keep all doors locked even if you are home.

If you're traveling:

- Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your home.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sure sign you're gone.

If you're out for the evening:

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone is home.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just a few minutes.
- Don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

If you're shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around vou.
- Park in a well-lighted space, and be sure to lock the car, close the windows and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash; pay with a check, debit or credit card whenever possible.
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Don't overburden vourself with packages. Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants
- Shopping with kids? Teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated.
