HOUSEKEEPING

Now that spring cleaning is nearing season's end, don't forget the largest yet most neglected area there is — your garage door. Please do not wash these doors with valuable, costly water! Take soft bristle brushes, brooms and rags to wipe them down. You may also find your front door and screen to be filled with debris of winter and webs of spring. Entries are the first impression presented, so please make them shine!

SOUNDS LIKE A GOOD IDEA

During the spring and summer months many of us have our windows open. It is especially important during this time of year that each of us is cognizant of the volume on our TVs, home stereo, and car stereo.

Reducing noise sounds like a good idea. A quiet, peaceful community, relatively speaking, is a happy community.

POOL RULES

- No glass containers are permitted at the Antares pool area.
- The Association does not provide lifeguard supervisory service. All injuries incurred are NOT the responsibility of the Association. It is the responsibility of each resident to ensure that children under the age of 14 are under direct supervision AT ALL TIMES of a designated responsible adult, 18 years or older, while in the pool area.
- No diapers are permitted in the pool.
- Bicycles, roller skates, roller blades, skateboards, and animals are not permitted in the pool.
- Entry to the pool area shall be through the gates only. Climbing over the pool fence or gates is prohibited.
- The pool gate is to remain closed at all times except when entering or exiting the pool area. Propping the gate open is strictly prohibited.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

CC&R's, Article 7.1 The Board of Directors has architectural control over both the exclusive and non-exclusive use portions of the common area.

CC&R's, Article 7.1.1 No changes or additions to the exterior of the living units (including the planting of trees, installation of antennas, satellite dishes, skylights, air conditioners, doors, screen doors, windows, sunshades, awnings, walls, fences, patio or deck covers, exterior painting, sports equipment, etc) may be made unless approved by the Board of Directors PRIOR TO STARTING ANY WORK.

CC&R's, Article 7.1.2 No clothing or household fabrics or other unsightly articles shall be hung, dried or aired on any portion of the Property, including the interior or any Residence, so as to be visible from other Residences or the street.

<u>CC&R's</u>, <u>Article 7.1.3</u> No portion of the Property shall be used for the storage of building materials, or any other materials.

BE CAUTIOUS

SDPD have reported that there has been a recent increase in the number of in the Carmel Valley area. In a number of

burglaries in the Carmel Valley area. In a number of cases, the burglars have gained access to homes by first stealing garage door openers out of parked vehicles. If you are parking your vehicle on the street or in a parking space overnight, do not leave your garage door opener (or any other valuable/personal items) in the vehicle. Don't make it easy for the bad guys. And please, report any suspicious persons or activity to the police right away.

FRONT DOOR AREAS

Newspapers, flyers, etc. piled up at your door give the appearance that nobody is home and could make your home a target for a break-in. Please remove any items from your front door on a daily basis. If you are going to be out of town, cancel your newspaper and have a neighbor remove any miscellaneous flyers that may be placed at your door.
